Who is Donte Hunt?

In 2007, Donte was elected to represent the people of St. George's South, a seat previously held by former PLP cabinet minister Renee Webb. Donte presently serves as the Shadow Minister for Community Development.

Donte is a strong advocate for family values and community service. He finds his greatest joy spending time with his wife Kelly and their two young daughters, Annalise and Laylah.

From the time he and his wife studied post graduate theology together in Toronto, Donte knew that serving people was his calling.
