Freshman, Praque, Czech Republic

Fresh off a march to the finals of the ITA East Regional Championship singles bracket, Hubickova opened the dual-match season by going 5-1, including a perfect 3-0 at No. 1 singles. Hubickova blanked Saint Anselm's Kaitlin Hughes, 6-0, 6-0, Tuesday, then beat American International's Meri Jimeno, 6-1, 6-1, Saturday, before toppling Adelphi's Barbie Quagliardi on Sunday, 2-6, 6-2, 6-4. Hubickova also teamed with sophomore Alexxa Etienne at No. 1 doubles to double-up Hughes and Emily Jacy, 6-3, and blank Jimeno and Mikaela Johnson, 6-0. The lone loss was to Quagliardi and Nicole Keilan, 6-7 (3-10).

(Fr., #1 S / #2 D - Pittsford, N.Y.) Freshman Josh Weiss (Pittsford, N.Y.) went 2-0 during his team's 9-0 win at Springfield on Saturday. Weiss won 8-4 at No. 2 doubles before claiming a 6-0, 6-1 victory at No. 1 singles.

Christian Duffy, Stonehill

(Fr. Dublin. Ireland)

Posted a combined 4-2 record in singles and doubles play for the Skyhawks. He was a double-winner in Stonehill's 7-0 win over Emerson, teaming up with senior Samuel Miller for a 6-2 win at No. 2 doubles and then rallying for a 1-6, 6-2, 10-6 triumph at No. 2 singles. He also Miller also split their two matches at Saturday's Connecticut College Invitational, picking up an 8-7 decision over the top doubles pairing from Eastern Nazarene. Duffy also split his two matches A-Singles bracket, Nichols' top singles player, Brandon Howard, 8-4.

Samuel Miller, Stonehill

(Sr. Smithfield, R.I.)

Posted a combined 5-1 record in singles and doubles play for the Skyhawks. Was a double-winner in Stonehill's 7-0 in over Emerson, combining with freshman Christian Duffy for a 6-2 win at No. 2 doubles and then adding a 6-1, 6-4 decision at No. 4 singles against Max Chalik. Miller also won both his matches in the C-Singles bracket at Saturday's Connecticut College Invitational, posting a 6-0, 3-6, 10-5 victory over Aaron Fleishman from Conn College and then a 3-6, 6-3, 10-5 win against Diego Rodriguez from Eastern Nazarene. He and Duffy also split their matches in the A-Doubles bracket, picking up an 8-7 decision over Eastern Nazarene's top pairing.

Alessa Matuty, Bentley

(So, - San Pedro Sula, Honduras) Matuty went 3-0 at No. 1 singles and won all three matches in straight sets. She earned wins against New Haven (6-2, 6-4), UMass-Dartmouth (6-0, 6-1) and Saint Michael's (6-3, 7-5). She also contributed to a win in No. 1 doubles against UMD (8-4) which helped Bentley to an overall 7-2 victory.

Posted a combined 3-1 record in singles and doubles play in a 2-0 week for the Skyhawks. She and sophomore Samantha Ormesher won both of their matches at No. 1 doubles, while splitting her two matches at No. 1 singles for the week. Porter was a double-winner in Sunday's 7-0 win at Saint Michael's, with she and Ormesher completing a sweep of the three doubles matches with their 6-3 win at No. 1. Porter then provided the match-clinching point for the Skyhawks with her 6-3, 6-2 win at No. 1 singles against senior Abby Ramsay. Porter and Ormesher claimed a 6-3 win at No. 1 doubles in Saturday's 5-2 win over Assumption.

Cristina Solorzano Valencia, Stonehill (Fr, - Morelia, Mexico)

Was a combined 4-0 in singles and doubles play in a 2-0 week for the Skyhawks. Won both of her matches at No. 2 singles and No. 2 doubles in wins over Assumption and at Saint Michael's.
