The results of our recent 2012 general election polling show the One Bermuda Alliance Party in a strong position ahead of next month's elections.

Economic concerns are the dominant issue for voters (46% cite the economy as the most important issue for their next government to address) and 70% say the country is on the wrong track. In addition, 75% of voters say the country should not continue the economic policies of the last five years. Other issues important issues that voters want their next government to address include gang warfare, crime, and youth unemployment. These data points indicate there is a strong case to make on that the country needs to make a change in leadership and a change in economic policies.
