

London/Bermuda Arbitration – Practical Thoughts and Considerations

A variety of international commercial agreements, including insurance policies and reinsurance agreements written out of the Bermuda Market, specify that disputes arising from these contracts be resolved through the London or Bermuda arbitration process. In this presentation, a panel of experts will address the practical thoughts and considerations when handling these disputes, focusing on insurance agreements written under the Bermuda Form which specifies dispute resolution through London or Bermuda arbitrations. The differences between London, Bermuda, and US arbitrations will be explored. In addition, practical considerations including the selection of arbitrators, the discovery process, pre-hearing motions, the arbitration itself, and post-arbitration issues will be addressed. Joining the panel will be two US and international attorneys and in-house representatives from multi-national insurance companies.

The Towering Infernos – Lloyds Markets, Syndicates, and Coverage Towers Explained

Whatever the cause, recent years have seen a dramatic increase in super-catastrophic losses involving insurance claims for billions of dollars in losses. The goal of this panel presentation is to provide useful, practical information to both US and UK claims counsel in navigating the unique and often complex issues raised in representing the London market in US claims litigation. Bill Perry will provide a historical perspective of Lloyd's and the London Market and will show how it is structured today. Dan Gerber will address diversity jurisdiction and the other complex issues which arise with respect to representation of multiple London Market insurers on the risk in US claims litigation. Julian Burling was the Counsel to Lloyd's for 15 years and will explain Lloyd's works today, TPA/MGA relationships, claims reporting, and handling issues involving insurance coverage "towers" and how they respond to 9, 10, and 11 figures plus losses. Mr. Burling is the author of the standard text on *Lloyds: Lloyds: Law and Practice* and is the joint editor of the *Research Handbook on International Insurance Law and Regulation*.

All Change! England Completes Insurance Law Review

English insurance law has undergone a root and branch review and in August 2016, a new regime will commence. Familiar concepts, such as avoidance for material non-disclosure, have been reformulated and will apply very differently. This is of relevance to any carrier writing insurance in the UK or reinsuring UK companies. It also informs insurers in other countries of an alternative approach to these issues. Moreover, it is likely that Bermuda will be in the process of adopting similar legislation.
