Have You Seen

DODDER?

What is it?

• Dodder is a leafless, parasitic plant that aggressively twines around host plants drawing nutrition from them.

Why is it a problem?

 Dodder grows rapidly into dense mats that shade out plants. Crop yields are reduced as the parasite robs the host plant of nutrients.

How does it spread?

 Dodder plants spread mainly by seed, but also by stem fragments.





How did it get here?

Possibly through contaminated imports of seed.

What do you do if you see it?

• If you see a plant you suspect may be dodder, report it immediately to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources at 239-2322 or plants@gov.bm. Do not move the plant as stem fragments or seeds may spread. Officers will visit the site and safely remove any dodder.
