



Service Eligibility

To be eligible to access secondary health community services:

- Be over the age of 18.
- Have an Intellectual disability (ID) defined by the World Health Organization
 - Reduced ability to cope independently.
 - Significantly reduced ability to understand new or complex information, or to learn new skills.
- Have a presenting health need requiring intervention from the multidisciplinary team.
 - The person's intellectual disability is directly affecting their ability to have their health need met through mainstream community services.
