

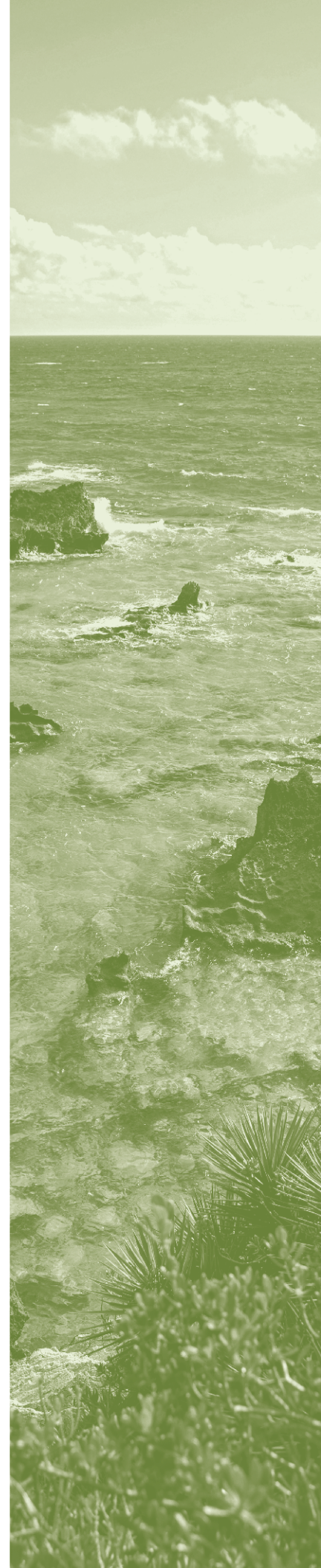

STILL GROWING

The Community Foundation Stands the Test of Time

IN 2014 WE PLANTED A TREE; by 2024 the roots had become firmly entrenched in healthy soil, the branches outstretched and leafy, offering shade to those who needed it. The tree had borne its first fruit, enough to offer sustenance to some. The tree had already withstood its first hurricanes and proved it could bend and sway in the wind and rain, ultimately remaining confidently upstanding. It had reached a level of maturity that boded well for a healthy future.

The image works well for the Bermuda Foundation's story. At the beginning of the Foundation's life cycle, we liked the tree analogy: "the best time to plant a tree for shade is 20 years ago; the second-best time is right now". It's what we told early supporters to illustrate why anyone would consider such a venture during a time of such economic strain and distress.

It turns out the timing was just fine - in fact, good. We've been able to demonstrate value in the stormy past decade and stepped in where needed. This document includes facts and figures to demonstrate what has been achieved over the past year.

The initially relatively unknown model of a community foundation for Bermuda is meeting its goals, although there is so much we could not have predicted! Fortunately, the organisation is resilient, designed to bend and sway to adapt to the needs of the day while remaining firmly rooted. Because that's how community foundations work.

When we opened our doors, we said we would do three things, namely:

1. Collect, analyse and report data to determine community needs
2. Pool donor dollars to establish collective giving funds
3. Champion giving practices that create conditions for thoughtful, strategic giving.

What enables us to deliver on this undertaking is the ongoing building of a lasting source of funds, an endowment, to support the community, through the work of the experts in the nonprofit organisations.

This "forever fund" received a significant boost in 2023-24 thanks to an extraordinarily generous donor. The promise of \$2 million - to be matched for a total of \$4 million - puts the BF operational budget on firmer financial footing for years to come. We exist to expand the philanthropic "pie", not take from it, and this is how we can deliver on that assurance.

Our clients are philanthropists - corporate, family and individual - and our role is to assist them to direct their resources most effectively. To do this, we need to thoroughly know and deeply understand Bermuda's most pressing needs - as well as the non-profit community that addresses these needs.

In short, we work with the funders, who sponsor those working in the nonprofit sector, who assist individuals and groups struggling to thrive in Bermuda's challenging economic circumstances. This includes those experiencing neglect, battling addiction, or struggling to make ends meet. And we must not forget the need for sponsorship of work that facilitates a flourishing and healthy community, in education, health, the arts, sports, and the environment. In order for Bermuda's community to fulfill its potential, this work remains crucial.

For the Bermuda Foundation itself, in-house, the past year has been unremitting in its challenges, large and small. When resources are limited and administrative regulatory demands enormous (and growing), it can be a strain to keep up. All not-for-profits are finding this aspect of their work increasingly burdensome. It's the price of globalisation, and it's not going to go away. But at times it does feel as though we don't have much more "bend and sway" left in our slender branches as the regulatory environment expands.

The good news is the Foundation is in excellent standing: our audits since the beginning have been unqualified; we retain our status as a compliant and respected Bermuda registered charity; we have maintained UK Community Foundation accreditation and are active in the network. Community foundation colleagues outside Bermuda, have complimented us on reaching this stage so early in our lifecycle. However, we are impatient and determined to keep our foot on the pedal. There is so much still to do.

But, with a tremendously supportive philanthropic community, terrific professional team, amazing volunteers, and outstanding Board, we are ready.

The purpose of the Bermuda Foundation (BF) is to build and manage funds that will sustain the nonprofit sector long term and to inspire philanthropy for social impact.

The nonprofit sector plays a crucial role in Bermuda, providing essential services in education, social welfare, health, sport, the environment, and the arts. Bermuda cannot afford to lose the services provided by its nonprofits.

Building a permanent endowment is central to addressing the needs of the community. Given that those needs will change over the years, the fund has been created with the flexibility to adapt to community priorities.

BF also enables corporations, individuals, and families to establish customised charitable funds, reducing the cost and infrastructure of setting up a private foundation or

trust. We assist donors to realise their philanthropic vision and create funds to support causes important to them. Permanent donors' funds are aggregated, invested and managed to achieve greater returns on investments.

To fulfill our mission to create an enduring source of funds forever dedicated to the good of Bermuda, we direct our efforts and dollars to priority community issues with the long-term aim of providing sustainable and enduring solutions. Through nonprofit partnerships, we support leadership development to strengthen local nonprofits and community groups.

We do this with integrity and respect for all involved and aspire to meet the highest standards of excellence.

OUR IMPACT AS A COMMUNITY OF DONORS

BERMUDA FOUNDATION'S grantmaking programmes are supported by a community of unrelated donors who wish to ensure the success and/or sustainability of nonprofits in Bermuda by creating endowment funds. These donors use the resources and expertise of BF to support their grantmaking in specific fields or general philanthropic interests that span all areas of the sector. Some of these donors are private individuals or entities who chose to keep a low profile on the scope and details of their giving.

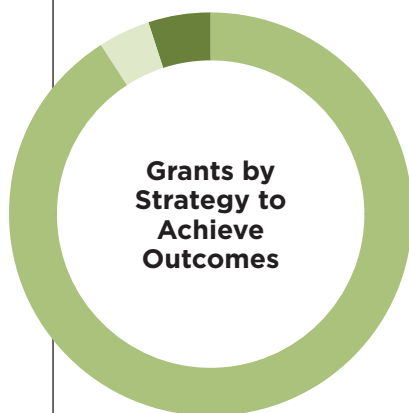
These donors' gifts, combined with our unrestricted funding contributions of \$394,950, resulted in grants nonprofits totalling almost \$4 million. Through the multiple donor-advised competitive grants programmes, BF reviewed more than 300 grant applications. Funds were directed in the following ways:¹

You can appoint a trusted friend or family member as your successor fund advisor or ask Bermuda Foundation to carry out your wishes in perpetuity.

2. Establish an Agency Fund

We don't just work with individual and family donors. In fact, Bermuda Foundation manages endowment funds on behalf of several charitable agencies. A charitable agency endowment fund provides for prudent capital growth coupled with a predictable source of income, which is particularly helpful in years where donations are down or government funding is reduced. Charitable agency endowment funds represent a broad spectrum of large and small organisations.

3. Support the aims of Community Impact Funds

Without a doubt, donor support in tackling the critical and emerging needs arising from the pandemic has been unsurpassed. However, we hope never to find ourselves in a position where we have to help the nonprofit sector secure rapid funding to ensure equitable and efficient access to the resources that make its work possible, such as: ensuring food is on the table for families in need during an unanticipated Island-wide shut-down; helping seniors homes stay staffed or keeping residents connected and safe; or ensuring antigen tests for front-line workers are accessible in a way that is fair and worthy of their sacrifice.

The Foundation is growing a community asset that will stand the test of time. Consider making a contribution to its permanent endowment funds, which will fund future needs like these and those we cannot yet imagine.

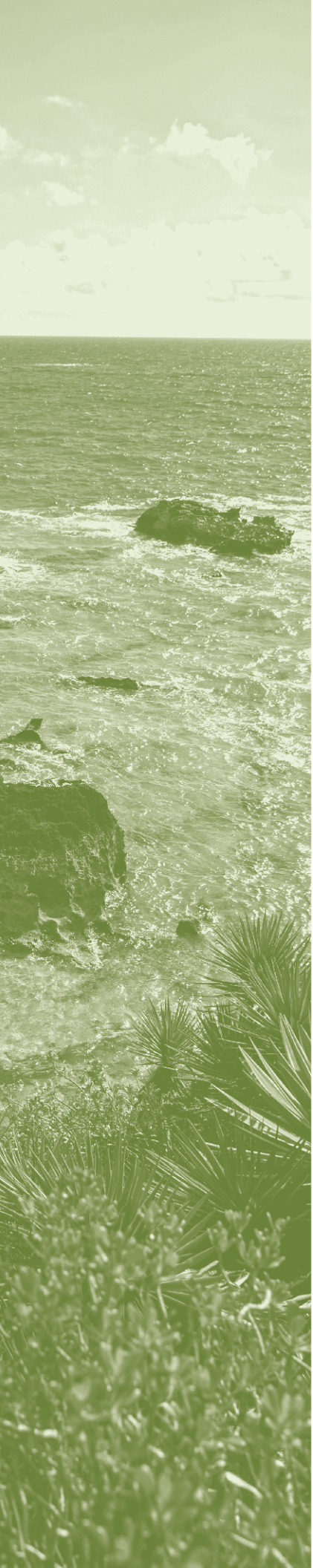
