The Ministry of Public Works and Environment advises the motoring public that a single-lane closure will be in effect on Orange Valley Road, in Devonshire, from Middle Road to Parson's Lane, to facilitate pull hole construction for water main replacement and paving works.

There will be no through access for general motorists along Orange Valley Road between Parsons' Lane and Middle Road. Access will be restricted to residents and wholesale warehouse traffic only. Motorists are advised to use the detour route via Parsons Lane from Middle Road to gain access to Jubilee Road.

~~Ongoing through Sunday, 1st February 2026 due to weather delays
Starting on Saturday, 23 January 2026, to Wednesday, 7th January 2026, Bermuda Waterworks~~
will be opening three (3) pull holes to upgrade underground water main lines:

- The first pull hole will be located in the northbound lane on Orange Valley Road, opposite the Post Office driveway entrance.
- The second pull hole will be approximately 180 feet north of the Post Office driveway entrance, in the same lane.
- The third pull hole will be located on Jubilee Road, near the Butterfield & Vallis driveway.

Traffic management for the pull-hole works will be carried out by Bermuda Waterworks representatives using stop-and-go signage. Container trucks heading to Jubilee Road and Post Office traffic will be granted access via Middle Road onto Orange Valley Road.

Additionally, starting on Monday, 5th January 2026, through Monday, 19th January 2026, Surface Experts will conduct milling and paving works along Orange Valley Road, starting from the northern end at the Parson's Lane junction and continuing south to Middle Road.

Traffic control for the paving works will be managed by Surface Experts representatives, utilising stop-and-go signs and temporary traffic signals. Only residential traffic will be granted access via Parsons' Lane to allow for paving works on both lanes to be carried out safely.

Working hours will be from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm daily.

The Ministry of Public Works and Environment encourages full cooperation from the motoring public and apologises for any inconvenience that may arise.
