ON THE SOUTHSIDE, KINDLEY FIELD ROAD ADJUSTMENT OF SPEED LIMIT.**

8:00 am – 9:45 am**

The Ministry of Public Works and Environment wishes to inform motorists that the Bermuda Triathlon Association will be holding a road race on Sunday, 26<sup>th</sup> April 2026, between 8:00 am & 9:45 am, on the following roads from Clearwater to Kindley Field.

The Bicycle portion of the triathlon race route is as follows:

Commencing at the Triathlon Shed, Clearwater Beach, proceed in a northerly direction along Cooper Island Road. At the roundabout of Cooper Island Road, Pepper Hall Road and Southside Road, take the second exit (i.e. straight), then travel in a northerly direction along Pepper Hall Road, crossing Tommy Fox Road and continuing in a northerly direction to St. David's Road. At St David's Road, take a left turn and remain on St David's Road, travelling in a westerly direction until the roundabout with Kindley Field Road and St. George's swing bridge. At the roundabout, take the second exit along Kindley Field Road in a westerly direction. A traffic cone will be placed in the middle of Kindley Field Road before the Airport Roundabout, where the road is widest, due to a parking layby. Cyclists will perform a 'U' Turn around the cone on Kindley Field Road before the Airport roundabout and return the way they came back to Clearwater Car Park to complete lap one (1) of three (3), and on the third lap, will continue back to the Triathlon Shed at Clearwater. Bermuda Police Service officers will be stationed at the five key junctions, along with race marshals, to direct traffic.

On the race route, only between 8:00 am and 9:45 am on Sunday, 26th April, the speed limit will be raised to 55km/hr to accommodate cyclists' speeds. It is noted that this is not a draft legal race, and so bike speeds will be slower.

Roads will remain open for this race, and cyclists will be mindful of traffic, with assistance from the Bermuda Police Service at key junctions to shift priorities in favour of cyclists.

During the race, motorists are advised to follow directions given by the Police and Race Officials.

Motorists are requested to show consideration for the participants by not impeding them or blocking the race route.

The Ministry of Public Works and Environment wishes to encourage the full cooperation of the motoring public and apologises for any inconvenience that may result.
